Fr Joseph writes: We continue with our series of columns on The Church.

The Church pt III — Preparation for God's Church

The Church was born with the outpouring of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost, but preparation for the birth of the Church began a long time before that. As it was always God's plan that we should go to heaven, then it was clearly always part of God's plan that there should be a Church to help us get there.

In some ways we could even say that God's words in the Book of Genesis – 'Let us make man to our image and likeness' (Gen 1:26) – was the beginning of God's plan for the existence of a Church because, as we shall see, the Church is the continuation in time of the presence of Christ, and it was the image of the Incarnate Word that God had in mind when He willed to make us in His image and likeness, even though Christ was born long after the creation of Adam. In other words, Christ was the model for Adam, and Christ's presence in the Church was God's model for the good ordering of human society from the outset.

All of the words and actions of the Patriarchs, and the Judges, and the Prophets from the Old Testament were part of the preparation for the eventual birth of the Church. Working His purpose out as year succeeded year, God laid the foundation stones for the eventual coming of His Kingdom on earth, slowly building a great edifice that would serve as the heavenly Temple of the new Jerusalem (Acts 21:1-2) with the individual followers of Christ as living stones built up into a spiritual house (1 Peter 2:5).

When King David planned to build a Temple, the Prophet Nathan said that it would be his son, Solomon, who would build it instead, but that God would appoint a place for His people and 'plant them, and they shall dwell therein' (2 Kgs 7:10), and that the house that would be built would have established within it the throne of God's Kingdom (2 Kgs 7:13). To continue Nathan's image of planting, we can see God continually sowing the seeds of His Church so that, in the fulness of time, it would grow and blossom to become a tree so that all 'the birds of the air [could] come and dwell in the branches thereof' (Mt 13:31-32).

When the work of preparation was done, and in the fulness of time when Our Lord finally began His public ministry, His opening words were, 'The time is accomplished, and the Kingdom of God is at hand: repent, and believe the Gospel' (Mk 1:15). The Patriarchs, and the Judges, and the Prophets have prepared the ground. Now, with the coming of the Word Incarnate, the Kingdom of God is being ushered in. Our Lord's teaching and miracles, His words and His deeds, all serve to sow the seed which will be watered with the outpouring of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost.

By gathering to Himself disciples, by choosing twelve of them to be Apostles, and by repeatedly choosing three of those Apostles (Ss Peter, James, and John) over and above the others, Our Lord even sets about establishing some of the structures of His Church and, by the time of His ascension back into heaven, makes it clear what their work is to be.
